

# Key Information Document

## Purpose

This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

## Product

The product you purchase is a limited partner's interest in Armira III GmbH & Co. KG (the "**Fund**", LEI: 39120092DJVE9NZ5WN76). The manufacturer is Armira Administration GmbH (the "**Manager**"), which belongs to the Armira-group. The website of the Manager is: [www.armira.de](http://www.armira.de). Call + 49 40 30 700 91 866 for more information. The Federal Financial Supervisory Authority (*BaFin*) is responsible for supervising the Manager in relation to this Key Information Document. The Manager is registered in Germany and regulated by the Federal Financial Supervisory Authority (*BaFin*). This Key Information Document was prepared on July 27, 2023.

**You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.**

## What is this product?

**Type:** The product is a limited partner's interest in the Fund.

**Term:** At least 15 years from the date of the first closing of the Fund plus an extension option of three years and plus a further extension option of two years. Any extension requires the prior approval of the fund's limited partner advisory committee (LPAC). The Fund is a so-called closed-end fund. This means that the interests in the Fund cannot be returned or sold to the Fund by the investor upon request. Cancellations of the participation in the Fund are also excluded – except in the cases prescribed by law.

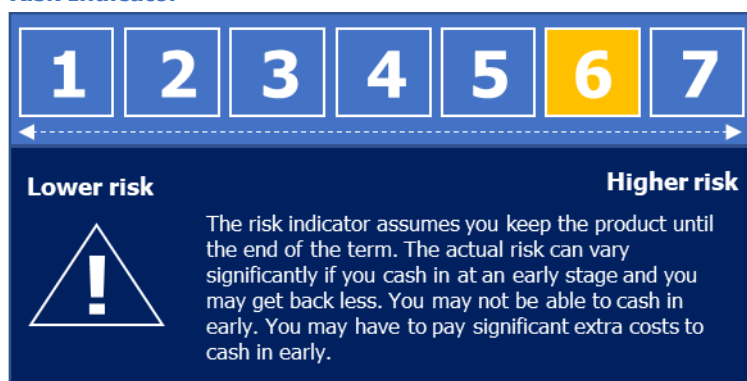
**Objectives:** The objective is to increase the capital invested by the investors during the term of the Fund. To this end, the Fund predominantly engages in all types of leveraged buy-outs (*e.g.*, management buy-outs, management buy-ins, owners' buy-outs, mergers, take-private transactions, spin-offs and carve-outs) as well as growth capital investments, preferably obtaining controlling stakes in portfolio companies. The Fund shall acquire, hold and sell such stakes. The investment focus lies in established medium-sized companies from all sectors with a material relation to Germany, Austria, Switzerland or Italy. The Fund allows for discretionary choices with respect to investments that are to be made, whereby this approach does not include a reference to a benchmark. Returns that exceed the costs incurred are generally returned to the investors or paid out to the Fund's initiators *via* carried interest. A portion of the returns (including any dividend income) may be reinvested. The return of the Fund depends on the performance of the investment assets held and the appropriate time of acquisition and disposal.

**Intended retail investor:** Semi-professional investors within the meaning of the German Investment Code (*Kapitalanlagegesetzbuch*). The statutory minimum capital commitment for semi-professional investors is EUR 200,000. The Fund is aimed at investors who have experience with private equity funds or venture capital funds, can hold the product for the long term and can cope with a total loss of their investment.

**Further information:** During the term of the Fund, it may become necessary to replace the Manager with another management company which will have been granted an authorization pursuant to Sec. 20 and 22 German Investment Code (*Kapitalanlagegesetzbuch*), to convert the Fund into a close-ended investment limited partnership (*geschlossene Investmentkommanditgesellschaft*) within the meaning of Sec. 149 *et seq.* German Investment Code (*Kapitalanlagegesetzbuch*) and, from such moment on, to ensure that the Fund at all times has a depositary. The limited partnership agreement of the Fund with further information about the Fund and descriptions of the investment strategy and objectives of the Fund can be made available in English by the Manager upon request. The latest annual report of the Fund (if available) can be made available in German by the Manager during reporting to investors and upon request. ## What are the risks and what could I get in return?

The risk indicator does not take into account that key persons may leave the Manager and that the default of other investors may affect the diversification of the Fund.

This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product in risk class 6 out of 7, which is the second highest risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance as "high" and poor market conditions are very likely to impact our capacity to pay you.

**Be aware of currency risk. The currency of this Fund may be different from that of your country. As you may receive payments in the currency of this Fund and not that of your country, the final return you get will depend on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown**

This product cannot be cashed in. If you exit the investment earlier than the recommended holding period, you may have to pay extra costs.

### What happens if the Manager is unable to pay out?

There is no contractually guaranteed pay-out. According to the provisions of the Fund's limited partnership agreement, investors will participate in the returns generated by the Fund. If the Fund has to file for bankruptcy, losses would be likely for the investors. A default of other companies (general partner or Manager), on the other hand, does not lead directly to financial losses for the investors, but can (temporarily or permanently) impair the Fund's ability to act. A possible loss is not covered by a compensation or security system for investors.

### What are the costs?

### Costs over Time

### How long should I hold it and can I take money out early? Recommended and required minimum holding period: at least 15 years

The product is a limited partner's interest in a closed-end fund. The investment should be held for the entire term of 15 years plus an extension option of three years and plus a further extension option of two years (each extension with prior LPAC approval). An early withdrawal of money is generally not possible. Also, the sale of the limited partner's interest is not possible without the consent of the Manager.

<sup>2</sup> This illustrates how costs reduce your return each year over the holding period. For example it shows that if you exit at the recommended holding period your average return per year is projected to be 20.9% before costs and 15.0% after costs.
